

Canton runners make their mark at 54th annual Falmouth Road Race

More than 100 Canton residents made their way down to Cape Cod last weekend to compete in the 54th running of the ASICS Falmouth Road Race. One of the premier running events of the summer season, the race annually draws an international field of Olympians, Paralympians, professional athletes, and recreational runners to enjoy the iconic seven-mile seaside course.

Canton’s top finisher this year was 41-year-old road racing veteran **John Ealy**, who placed third in his age group

and 151st overall out of a field of over 11,000 runners with a time of 42:28 — good for a 6:04 pace and several minutes faster than the nos. 2 and 3 finishers from Canton, 33-year-old **Christian Baglini** (408th, 48:18) and 38-year-old **Michael Devlin** (469th, 49:08). Other local residents who placed in the top 10 percent of runners included **Sam Siegal**, a rising Canton High School senior and multi-sport athlete (587th, 50:43); **Alec Ragusa**, a former CHS football standout who went on to play at Merrimack College (839th, 53:22); and **Mike Loughran**, a CHS alumnus, current Select Board member,

and candidate for state representative in the 6th Norfolk District (877th, 53:34). Not too far behind Loughran was 2025 CHS grad and Bulldog ice hockey legend **Travis Thomas**, who finished 74th in the 15-19 age group (54:33) — just a few spots ahead of his younger brother **Chase Thomas** (55:02), a rising CHS sophomore who already has a pair of state titles under his belt in ice hockey and golf.

Rounding out the top 10 finishers

for Canton at this year’s race was 2020 CHS grad **Chris Lavoie** (55:32), who also made a name for himself in hockey and golf during his time with the Bulldogs.

Other recent CHS grads who completed the seven-mile course included multi-sport standout **Nora Giannacopoulos** from the Class of 2026; **Sara Yeaton**, **Katherine Yeaton** and **Ashley Balunas** from the Class of 2025; **Brendan Tourgee** and **Lila Spinelli** from the Class of 2024; **Alexander**

Thomas, **Marissa Staffiere**, **Shannon McGrann**, **Ella Yeaton**, **Matt Yeaton** and **Sierra Abbott** from the Class of 2023; **Dylan Coyne**, **Allie Gefteas** and **Nicole Wright** from the Class of 2021; **Emma Cunningham**, **Tommy Ghostlaw**, **Juliana Agnitti**, **Ronan O’Mahony**, **Caroline Tourgee**, **Kaitlyn Goyetch** and **Alexa Maffeo** from the Class of 2020; and **Michaela Hannigan**, **Ryan Nolte**, **Lili Fleming**, **Rose Gefteas** and **Rachel Beatty** from the Class of 2019.

Also part of this year’s field were a few current CHS students, including budding cross-country star **Tristan**

Grant along with rising senior **Maite Iriarte** and rising sophomore **Sydney Merchant**.

Canton was also well-represented in the more veteran age groups, with a total of 24 runners aged 50+ completing this year’s race, led by **Ilise Prendergast**, who bested all but three of the 130 runners in her age group. **David Prendergast** also impressed (35th out of 184), as did Canton’s **Mary Collins** (19th out of 242) and **Susan Ferrera** (17th out of 130).

This ORDER FOR SERVICE BY PUBLICATION (the “Notice”) is to provide notice that Creative Dental Enterprises, Inc., is being sued: Uniave Two LLC having made a claim for money owed pursuant to a Lease Agreement between Plaintiff and Defendant by filing of a Complaint with the Westborough District Court as above identified.

Creative Dental Enterprises, Inc., must respond within twenty (20) days to protect its rights by delivery or by mail of a written response (called an “Answer”) to the Complaint. Such Answer must be provided to both the Clerk of the Westborough District Court, 186 Oak Street, Westborough, MA 01581

and to the Law Offices of Joseph R. Jenkins PLLC, 118 Flanders Road, Suite 4200, Westborough, MA 01581 (508)366-1002 (from whom a copy of the Complaint may also be acquired).

The Answer must respond to each claim made by the Plaintiff. The Answer is the written response to the statements and claims made by the Plaintiff in the Complaint.

The Answer must list any reason why the Defendant claims it should not have to pay the Plaintiff what the Plaintiff asks for (the ‘defenses’) in Plaintiffs Complaint.

If an Answer is not sent to the Court and the Plaintiff as required, the Court may order that the Plaintiff receive everything requested in the Complaint.

The parties are entitled to legal help of their own choosing.

The Defendant also has the right to file a claim for money owed by the Plaintiff or for harm that the Plaintiffs actions or inactions may have caused the Defendant.

The Defendant must attend all court hearings upon notice of same from the Court.
